Tom Davis gave a reminder about renewing terms, saying if you are wanting to continue, you'll need a letter from your nominating agency stating that. That goes to the integrating committee to factor in with the other candidates that might apply. Angela Farley asked that those be sent to her. Jonathan confirmed with Angela that she'd received his.

Tom Davis went over the whole process for the new members. Tom stated NRAC 17, like all the other NRACs, set a different schedule for when applications are due to the NRAC.

We get our allocation notice this time of year for about how much we have for the next year, so we have to set a schedule for when applications are due and what applications have to have in them. We actually have the ability to look at the format for the application and what we would like to see and how we score those kinds of things, this will be done at our February meeting.

Applications have to be put out a certain number of days before they are due and OPWC has to approve those applications – the methodology. Applications are due end of September – first of October.

Reviews are done next, and site visits if there's time. Then we make our recommendations to OPWC. We are not the statutory agency that provides the dollars but we provide recommendations for the six-county district to the agency that does, OPWC. From there out, the applicants deal with OPWC through legal documents and that type of stuff.

We should be proud, we've had 55 different projects that have been preserved, totaling over probably 25-30 million dollars.

Mr. Davis stated that usually we're here at this time looking at applications that Angela has sent us for review and scoring, however, after this application deadline we ran into some issues. This year, applications were done on the new OPWC's portal. Some information is coming to the NRAC directly, as each individual NRAC can request separate information, other than what goes to OPWC. All the applications this time were either incomplete or ineligible. After discussion with Nick of OPWC, and his boss Linda, we determined that all of them had an issue.

The Board discussed the options of either scrapping this round and take new applications or combining this Round with Round 18, which starts next March. Angela stated we wouldn't get applications until August or September. There was agreement on an accelerated round so these applications could proceed as they likely have timelines as well. A portal will be opened up and applicants will have 60 days to get things fixed and new people to be put in. People who had submitted will be able to clone their original application, add the missing material on the OPWC website and submit that. Angela will be available for assistance uploading the full pdf to her. Tom stated we'll work with each individual applicant and help them resolve any issues.
